Volunteering at the Church of Our Saviour

At the Church of Our Saviour, we have various groups that organize different activities around various subjects. The African Community Group brings our African parishioners together with various activities throughout the year.

Fidelis Nthenge, the outgoing African Community Group coordinator, gives us an insight into the Group's activities.

By definition, the African Group of Church of Our Saviour, welcomes anyone with ties to the African continent by birth, marriage, or the mere desire to belong to it. The African Community Group Coordinator and the committee welcome African parishioners and encourage them to be active participants of the COS and the African Group.

Members are encouraged to collaborate and engage with the church activities and organize fundraising activities as needed by the church. This could be through the annual food fair or any other social functions in the church aimed at raising funds for charity.

The African Community Group is involved in church cleaning, the refugee program, the Sunday lunchroom, and other social functions for the members to share, bond, and celebrate together. One of the events that everyone looks forward to is the African Group annual summer BBQ.

The group takes an active part in leading the liturgy at least once a year on one of the Sundays in the month of September, when the African group takes lead in the liturgy, ranging from leading the choir and singing African hymns in various African languages, as well as doing the readings, and organizing the offertory collection and procession.

The other outreach activities which the African Community group organizes include:

• Visiting our own members and supporting them when they have lost loved ones.

• Celebrating with our members when they celebrate major milestones in their lives like weddings, baptisms, birthdays, baby showers, etc.

For those of us who have moved around in different countries, we know that there is nothing better than feeling at home away from home. That's how we feel in The Hague because we have the African Community Group of the Church of Our Saviour, The Hague!
